Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
Sec. 1. 7 MRSA §241, first ¶, as enacted by PL 1989, c. 194, is
amended to read:
The Commissioner of Agriculture, Food and Rural Resources
shall appoint, subject to the Civil Service Law, an Education Specialist II or agricultural education consultant. The person
appointed shall:
Sec. 2. 7 MRSA §241, sub-§1, as enacted by PL 1989, c. 194, is
amended to read:
1. Public awareness. Produce audio-visual audiovisual
materials, facilitate public service programming, prepare written
materials, organize a speakers' bureau and otherwise educate the
public. The eemmissiener <u>appointee</u> , in carrying out these duties, shall address the following needs: maintaining a lasting
and sustainable agriculture; protecting our critical rural
infrastructures; quaranteeing continued and effective production
and marketing of fresh fruits, vegetables and livestock;
preserving prime farmland; conserving our soils and water; and generally ensuring the quality of life in rural Maine.
Sec. 3. 20-A MRSA $\S253$, sub- $\S6$, as amended by PL 1985, c. 785, Pt. A, $\S78$, is repealed.
Sec. 4. Appropriation. The following funds are appropriated
from the General Fund to carry out the purposes of this Act.
