'Sec. 2. Study group; development of standards and indicators. The Commissioner of Education shall convene a 15-member study group to develop recommended content standards and performance indicators in the areas of English language arts, mathematics, science and technology and social studies. Simultaneously, each 8 school administrative unit shall review the learning standards 10 set forth in the report of the Task Force on Learning Results, established pursuant to Public Law 1993, chapter 290, 12 learning standards adopted by the State of Virginia and the criteria established in this section. The department shall 14 supply school administrative units with a copy of the report of the task force, a copy of the Virginia standards and a copy of 16 the criteria. Each school administrative unit shall report its findings to the study group.

1. Membership. The study group consists of the following 20 members:

> A. Two members of the Senate, appointed by the President of the Senate;

B. Two members of the House of Representatives, appointed by the Speaker of the House;

C. One member from the Department of Education, appointed by the Commissioner of Education;

D. One member of the State Board of Education, appointed by the board;

- 34 E. One teacher appointed by the Governor;
- F. Three representatives of Maine business, appointed by the Governor; and

G. Five parents of Maine students, grades kindergarten through 12, 2 appointed by the President of the Senate, 2 appointed by the Speaker of the House and one appointed by the Governor.

- 2. Recommendations. The study group shall develop its recommendations in accordance with the following criteria.
- A. The paramount purpose of the standards is to improve academic performance.

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- C. The standards may not focus on social, behavioral and moral issues that do not lend themselves to a standard-setting mechanism.
- D. The standards must outline the essential knowledge to be learned and the skills to be acquired in each subject area.
- 12 E. Each standard must be clear and specific.
- F. Standards must be defined grade-by-grade in a framework that provides effective guidance to all participants in the educational system.
- 18 G. The standards must facilitate a student's transition from one school to another within the State.
- H. The standards may not attempt to cover everything to be taught but must focus on what is essential for students to learn.
- I. The standards must be rigorous, challenging and competitive with those that prevail in other states and societies.
 - J. The standards must both motivate and measure student performance.
- 32 K. Content standards must define the knowledge and skills essential to each discipline.
- L. Performance standards must specify the level of competence necessary to measure attainment of the content standards.
 - M. Standards must include multiple performance levels.
- N. Standards must combine both knowledge and skills without pursuing one at the expense of the other.
- O. Standards may illustrate, but not dictate, the methods by which material is to be taught.
- P. The standards must be written clearly enough that both parents and teachers understand what is expected of students and can use the standards as a practical means of measuring progress.

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Following development of the recommendations, the content standards and performance indicators in those subject areas must be established subject to rules established jointly by the Department of Education and the State Board of Education in accordance with the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 5, chapter 375, subchapter II. Proposed rules must be circulated to all school administrative units and the public during the rule-making process. The department and the board shall consider carefully the recommendations of school administrative units in the rule-making process. Rules adopted pursuant to this Act are major substantive rules, as defined in Title 5, chapter 375, subchapter II-A, and must be reviewed by the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over education and cultural affairs and approved by the Legislature. 2	amendment provides a General Fund appropriation to the Department of Education of \$7,000 in fiscal year 1996-97 to reimburse the travel expenses of legislative and public members of the group
4	and for printing costs.
6	The amendment proposes review and reporting requirements or school administrative units, which will result in additional
8	expenditures to the units. The Maine Revised Statutes, Title 30-A, section 5685 requires the State to provide sufficient
10	amounts to meet at least 90% of these additional costs and to distribute the funds in accordance with a mandate payment
12	distribution schedule.
14	The amendment provides a General Fund appropriation of \$12,750 in fiscal year 1996-97 for the Department of Education.
16	The one-time printing, postage and meeting costs incurred by the school administrative units, estimated to average approximately
18	\$50 per unit, will be paid from this appropriation by the Department of Education in accordance with the distribution
20	schedule.

24	This amendment combines the majority and minority reports of
26	the Joint Standing Committee on Education and Cultural Affairs by specifying the learning standards that each school administrative

30	This amendment establishes a 15-member study group to develop and recommend standards only in the areas of English
