An Act to Increase the Reimbursement Levels for Forest Fire Suppression Costs.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows: 2 Sec. 1. 12 MRSA §9204, as repealed and replaced by PL 1991, 4 c. 780, Pt. MM, §1, is repealed and the following enacted in its place: 6 §9204. Payment of costs; state reimbursement 8 Municipalities shall pay for controlling and extinguishing forest fires up to 1/2 of 1% of their state valuation and the 10 State shall reimburse the municipalities for 1/2 of the costs incurred by the forest fire warden in charge. Reimbursement is 12 not allowed for use or loss of municipally owned equipment within the town in which the fire occurred. A municipality going to the 14 aid of another, even to protect itself, when requested by the 16 state forest ranger in charge, is entitled to be paid for suppression of fire costs by the municipality aided if the total suppression cost of the fire in that municipality is not over 1/218 of 1% of its state valuation. 20 Sec. 2. 12 MRSA §9205, as amended by PL 1991, c. 780, Pt. MM, \S_2 , is repealed and the following enacted in its place: 22 24 §9205. Payment of costs beyond 1/2 of 1% of state valuation 26 The State shall pay all forest fire suppression costs in municipalities in an amount greater than 1/2 of 1% of the state valuation of the municipality in which the fire occurred. A 28 municipality, in order to pay labor guickly, may pay beyond 1/2 30 of 1% of the state valuation and submit for full reimbursement or forward the unpaid bills, approved by the state forest ranger in charge, for payment. 32 34 STATEMENT OF FACT 36 municipalities Under current law, are entitled to reimbursement for incurred forest fire suppression costs that 38 exceed .25% of their state valuation. Anything above this threshold is reimbursed by the State. 40 This bill changes the law by repealing the threshold amount 42 and requiring the State to reimburse municipalities for 50% of 44 the costs incurred by the municipalities, regardless of the amount of the costs of fire suppression. The State must continue to pay for or reimburse the municipality for forest fire 46 suppression costs above .25% of the state valuation of the 48 municipality. The effect of the changes made by this bill would be felt 50 incur municipalities that currently fire those only by .25% valuation 52 suppression costs that do not reach the This bill returns the law to the language that threshold. existed prior to changes that were made in 1991. 54

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
