Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this Act takes effect when approved.

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#### 30 STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill provides the framework to establish a federally funded depot-level military rebuild site at the former Loring Air Force Base. The Maine National Guard has submitted a proposal to the United States Department of Defense, National Guard Bureau to operate a 100% federally funded depot-level equipment rebuild site at that location. The National Guard Bureau requires that employees not be federal employees but the National Guard Bureau will pay all the expenses of the facility.
