An Act to Amend the Atlantic Salmon Authority.

2	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
2 4	Sec. 1. 12 MRSA §9901, sub-§2, as enacted by PL 1995, c. 406, §12, is repealed and the following enacted in its place:
6	2. Members; appointment composition; term. The authority
8	is governed by the Atlantic Salmon Board, referred to in this chapter as the "board." The board consists of 9 members including the current Commissioner of Marine Resources and the
10	Commissioner of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife. The Governor shall appoint the remaining 7 members, subject to review by the
12	joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over fisheries and wildlife matters and to confirmation by the
14	Senate. The Governor shall select the appointees to adequately represent the various aspects of Atlantic salmon issues over
16 18	which the board has jurisdiction. The Governor may appoint the 4 river drainage representatives from a list of names submitted by salmon clubs and may appoint the Native American representatives
20	from a list of names submitted by the Penobscot Nation and the Passamaquoddy Tribe. In addition to the Commissioner of Marine
22	Resources and the Commissioner of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife, the board consists of the following appointed members:
24	A. One member who resides within the land area comprising the Penobscot River or Ducktrap River drainages;
26	B. One member who resides within the land area comprising
28	the Saco River or Sheepscot River drainages;
30	<u>C. One member who resides in the Aroostook River drainage</u> area;
32 34	D. One member who resides within those land areas that comprise the drainage for the St. Croix, East Machias,
36	Machias, Narraguagus, Pleasant or Dennys rivers;
38	E. One member of the Passamaquoddy Tribe;
40	F. One member of the Penobscot Nation; and
42	G. One member at-large representing the public from a geographical area not specified in this subsection.
44	Of the initial appointees, 2 members are appointed for one-year terms, 2 members are appointed for 2-year terms and 3 members are
46	appointed for 3-year terms. Thereafter, members are appointed for 3-year terms. A vacancy must be filled in the same manner as
48	an original member for the unexpired portion of the term. An appointed member may not serve for more than 2 consecutive 3-year

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Sec. 2. 12 MRSA §9902, first ¶, as enacted by PL 1995, c. 406, §12, is amended to read:

Notwithstanding-any-other-provision-of--Title--L2r-the-The authority has the sole authority and responsibility to manage the 8 Atlantic salmon fishery in the State, including the sole authority to introduce Atlantic salmon into Maine inland waters, 10 other than commercial aquaculture facilities and associated 12 activities. This sole authority does not take effect for the inland waters of the Sheepscot, Narraguagus, Pleasant, Machias, East Machias and Dennys rivers until July 1, 1997. The authority 14 has the sole authority to limit or prohibit the taking of Atlantic salmon, issue licenses for the taking of Atlantic salmon 16 and adopt rules establishing the time, place and manner of Atlantic salmon fishing in all waters of the State. In addition 18 to these powers and duties, the authority may:

Sec. 3. 12 MRSA §9902, sub-§4, as enacted by PL 1995, c. 406, 22 §12, is amended to read:

24 4. Rules. Adopt rules necessary to manage the Atlantic salmon fishery and to promote the conservation and propagation of the Atlantic salmon. Rules adopted by the authority must be 26 enforced by the Department of Marine Resources, the Department of 28 Fisheries and Wildlife and other public officials Inland authorized by law to enforce marine resource laws or inland 30 fisheries and wildlife laws. The Department of Marine Resources and the Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife retain 32 exclusive jurisdiction over rules pertaining to species other than Atlantic salmon that are designed to promote the 34 conservation and propagation of Atlantic salmon. The departments shall consult with the Atlantic Salmon Authority in adopting such rules; 36

38 Sec. 4. 12 MRSA §9904, sub-§§4 and 5, as enacted by PL 1995, c. 406, §12, are repealed.

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Sec. 5. PL 1995, c. 406, §19, sub-§7 is amended to read:

7. Not later than January <u>December</u> 1, 1996, the Chair of
the Atlantic Salmon Board shall submit a report to the Joint Standing Committee on Inland Fisheries and Wildlife. The report
must include the board's plan for managing the Atlantic salmon fishery in the State and any statutory recommendations pertaining
to staffing or budget matters that the board determines necessary to implement that plan. The Joint Standing Committee on Inland
Fisheries and Wildlife may report out legislation to the Second

Regular--Session--of--the--117th Legislature to implement the statutory recommendations of the board.

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STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill clarifies the appointment criteria and process for 8 the members of the Atlantic Salmon Board. It also adds one member at-large to the board to represent the public and clarifies that the Commissioner of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife 10 and the Commissioner of Marine Resources are exempt from the 12 confirmation process. The bill restricts the Atlantic Salmon Authority's role to inland waters other than commercial hatcheries, with the exception of the Ducktrap, 14 Sheepscot, Narraguagus, Pleasant, Machias, East Machias and Dennys rivers. The delay in the effective date of authority over those rivers is 16 to allow the executive branch adequate opportunity to respond to a proposed federal listing of Atlantic salmon. The board will 18 report back to the Joint Standing Committee on Inland Fisheries 20 and Wildlife by December 1, 1996 concerning management of Atlantic salmon and recommendations on staffing and budget.
