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# COMMITTEE AMENDMENT

## COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to S.P. 741, L.D. 1849

'Sec. 1. Authorization of bonds to provide for funds to construct 2 water pollution control facilities and to address environmental health 4 deficiencies in drinking water supplies. The Treasurer of State is authorized, under the direction of the Governor, to issue bonds in the name and on behalf of the State in an amount not exceeding 6 \$10,000,000 to raise funds to construct water pollution control facilities and to address environmental health deficiencies in 8 drinking water supplies as authorized by section 6. The bonds 10 are a pledge of the full faith and credit of the State. The bonds may not run for a period longer than 10 years from the date of the original issue of the bonds. At the discretion of the 12 Treasurer of State, with the approval of the Governor, any issuance of bonds may contain a call feature.' 14

16 Further amend the bill by striking out all of section 6 and inserting in its place the following:

'Sec. 6. Allocations from General Fund bond issue; construct water
 pollution control facilities; address environmental health deficiencies in drinking water supplies. The proceeds of the sale of bonds must be
 expended as designated in the following schedule.

38 Further amend the bill in section 10 by striking out all of the question (page 3, lines 37 to 49 in L.D.) and inserting in 40 its place the following:

42 "Do you favor a \$10,000,000 bond issue for the following \$8,000,000 to construct water pollution purposes: (1) facilities, providing the match 44control state for \$10,000,000 in federal funds; and (2) \$2,000,000 to address environmental health deficiencies 46 in drinking water supplies?"' 48

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## COMMITTEE AMENDMENT

COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "/1" to S.P. 741, L.D. 1849

Further amend the bill by inserting at the end before the statement of fact the following:

### **'FISCAL NOTE**

The estimated cost of sending this bond issue out to 8 referendum will vary according to the total number of referenda enacted during the Second Regular Session of the 117th 10 Legislature to be submitted to the voters in November. The estimated cost to the Secretary of State if one to 6 referenda 12 are enacted is \$95,000. Each additional referendum costs an additional \$7,000.

If approved by the voters, the total cost of this bond issue is estimated to be \$12,832,500 with principal payments of \$10,000,000 and interest payments of approximately \$2,832,500.'

20 STATEMENT OF FACT

22 This amendment lowers the amount of the bond issue to \$10,000,000 and proposes to use the proceeds as follows:

1. \$8,000,000 to construct water pollution control
26 facilities; and

28 2. \$2,000,000 to address environmental health deficiencies in drinking water supplies.

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The amendment also makes other technical changes and adds a 32 fiscal note.
