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## COMMITTEE AMENDMENT

COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to S.P. 748, L.D. 1858

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Further amend the bill by inserting at the end before the 2 statement of fact the following:

## **'FISCAL NOTE**

This bill may increase prosecutions for Class E crimes. If a jail sentence is imposed, the additional costs to the counties are estimated to be \$83.70 per day per prisoner. These costs are not reimbursed by the State. The number of prosecutions that may result in a jail sentence and the resulting costs to the county jail system are expected to be insignificant.

14 The additional workload and administrative costs associated with the minimal number of new cases filed in the court system 16 can be absorbed within the budgeted resources of the Judicial Department. The collection of additional fines may increase 18 General Fund revenue by minor amounts.

20 Eliminating a certain limit for exemptions under the site location of development laws will result in insignificant 22 reductions of dedicated revenue to the Department of Environmental Protection from permit fees.'

## STATEMENT OF FACT

28 This amendment corrects a technical error in the designation of imperiled natural communities and removes the 10-acre limit on 30 the size of farm and fire ponds that are exempted from permitting under the site location of development laws. The amendment also 32 adds a fiscal note to the bill.
