Sec. 1. 26 MRSA §626, as amended by PL 1991, c. 162, is further amended by adding at the end a new paragraph to read:

Within 2 weeks after the sale of a business, the seller of the business shall pay employees of that business any wages earned while employed by the seller. If the terms of employment include provisions for paid vacations, vacation pay on cessation of employment has the same status as wages earned. The seller of a business may comply with the provisions of this paragraph through a specific agreement with the buyer in which the buyer agrees to pay any wages earned by employees through employment with the seller and to honor any paid vacation earned under the seller's vacation policy.

Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this Act takes effect when approved.'

Further amend the bill by inserting at the end before the statement of fact the following:

## 'FISCAL NOTE

This bill may increase the number of civil suits filed in the court system. The additional workload and administrative costs associated with the minimal number of new cases filed can be absorbed within the budgeted resources of the Judicial Department. The collection of additional filing fees may also increase General Fund revenue by minor amounts.'

## STATEMENT OF FACT

This amendment permits the seller to comply with the requirement that employees be compensated for wages earned and accrued vacation time by entering into an agreement with the buyer for the buyer to assume that obligation to pay unpaid wages and honor accrued vacation time. The amendment also adds an emergency preamble, an emergency clause and a fiscal note to the bill.
