An Act to Facilitate the Implementation of a Logo Sign Program on the Interstate.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

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Sec. 1. 23 MRSA $\S1912$ -B, first \P , as enacted by PL 1995, c. 416, $\S1$, is amended to read:

Pursuant to rules adopted under this commissioner may authorize the placement of logo signs within the right-of-way of the interstate system. A logo sign may not be larger than existing service information signs permitted on the interstate highway. More-than-one-sign-per-exit-is-prohibited. A-logo-sign-may-include-logos-for-tourist-attractions,-such-as museums -- or -- other -- locations -- of -- public -- interest -- - To -- the -- fullest extent--possible/--the--commissioner--shall--ensure--that--each--logo sign-include-at-least-one-logo-for-gas, one-logo-for-food-and-one loge-for-lodging. Logo signs may be installed only on portions of the interstate highway that are rural in character. A logo sign may include only logos for gas, food, lodging and camping. Applications from at least 3 qualified businesses must be approved before installation of a logo sign panel at an exit. When 3 or more qualified businesses providing the same service are located at an exit, a separate sign panel must be installed for that service. Rules adopted under this section must regulate the size, shape, manner and location of logo signs and must describe the procedure for applying to the department for permission to erect a logo sign and the criteria used by the department to select among applicants. The commissioner shall eharge establish an initial fee for the production and placement of a logo sign and an annual fee to cover the maintenance costs. Fees charged must approximate direct costs.

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STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill restricts logo signs on the interstate highway to areas of the interstate that are rural in character. It allows logo signs only for businesses providing gas, food, lodging and camping. It specifies that a separate logo sign must be installed for a particular type of service if 3 or more qualified businesses are located at an exit.
