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Sec. 2. 23 MRSA §1964. sub-§6-A. as amended by PL 1995, c. 504, Pt. C, $\S3$, is further amended to read:

6-A. Operating surplus. "Operating surplus" means the total annual operating revenues of the Maine Turnpike Authority, 10 after money has been put aside to pay the reasonable operating 12 expenses, to pay or to reserve for capital expenditures and to meet the requirements of any resolution authorizing bonds of the 14 Maine Turnpike Authority, including any amounts pledged to secure obligations issued pursuant to section 1968, subsection 2-A or to 16 pay principal, interest or premium, if any, with respect to these obligations.

Sec. 3. 23 MRSA §1965-A, sub-§1, ¶A, as enacted by PL 1995, c. 341, $\S2$, is amended to read: 20

22 Convert Complete an evaluation of the conversion of the Α. turnpike toll collection system to an automated electronic 24 system designed to move traffic more efficiently through toll plazas;'

Further amend the bill by inserting at the end before the 28 emergency clause the following:

'Sec. 3. Legislative intent. Those sections of this bill that 30 amend the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 23, section 1962, subsection 6 and Title 23, section 1964, subsection 6-A clarify 32 the intent of Initiated Bill 1991, chapter 1, to have the Legislature approve the Maine Turnpike Authority's operating 34 budget and confirm the authority's practice of submitting an 36 operating budget for approval and a statement on capital expenditures and debt service for informational purposes.

- Sec. 4. Retroactivity. Those sections of this Act that amend 40 the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 23, section 1961, subsection 6 and section 1964, subsection 6-A apply retroactively to December 42 20, 1991.'
- 44 Further amend the bill by relettering or renumbering any nonconsecutive Part letter or section number to read 46 consecutively.

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FISCAL NOTE

4 This bill allocates an additional \$4,800,000 in the Fare Collection program of the Maine Turnpike Authority due to the delay in implementing an automated electronic toll system. This 6 will not affect State Government expenditures or revenues.' 8 10 STATEMENT OF FACT 12 This amendment makes it clear that legislative approval is not required for capital expenditures by the Maine Turnpike 14 Authority or for expenditures necessary to satisfy requirements of bond resolutions. Legislative approval is required for the authority's operating budget. 16 This amendment also removes the requirement that the turnpike convert to an automated toll 18 collection system prior to completing its alternatives evaluation. The authority is still required to evaluate the 20 conversion to an automated system.
