SENATE AMENDMENT "A " to H.P. 1363, L.D. 1873, Bill, "An Act to Implement the Recommendations of the Productivity Realization Task Force and to Make Supplemental Appropriations and Allocations for the Expenditures of State Government and to Change Certain Provisions of the Law Necessary to the Proper Operations of State Government for Fiscal Years Ending June 30, 1996 and June 30, 1997"

Amend the bill in Part K in section 11 by striking out all of paragraph G (page 240, lines 34 and 35 in L.D.) and inserting in its place the following:

'G. Bath Children's Home.'

Further amend the bill in Part K in section 15 in paragraph C by striking out all of subparagraph (9) (page 242, lines 13 and 14 in L.D.) and inserting in its place the following:

'(9) Director, Bath Children's Home;'

Further amend the bill in Part K in section 75 in that part designated "~~§6251.~~" in subsection 2 in the 2nd line (page 266, line 30 in L.D.) by striking out the following: "Until June 30, 1996,"

Further amend the bill in Part K by striking out all of section 81.

Further amend the bill by relettering or renumbering any nonconsecutive Part letter or section number to read consecutively.

REVENUES

General Fund	\$80,000
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This amendment has no net effect on the General Fund in the 1996-1997 biennium. It increases General Fund appropriations by \$80,000 in fiscal year 1996-97, but increases General Fund undedicated revenue by \$80,000 in fiscal year 1996-97. It does increase net Federal Expenditure Fund allocations by \$237,653 in fiscal year 1996-97.

The projected balance in unappropriated surplus is unchanged by this amendment.

STATEMENT OF FACT

The bill provides for the discontinuance of the Bath Children's Home on July 1, 1996. This amendment allows the Bath Children's Home to continue.
