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Amend the amendment on page 2 by inserting before the first indented paragraph the following:

'Further amend the bill by inserting after section 2 the following:

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'Sec. 3. 12 MRSA §8612, first  $\P$ , as enacted by PL 1989, c. 555,  $\S$ 8, is amended to read:

The bureau shall employ by 1991, July 1, 1997 at least 16 field foresters te-be--located--in-field-effices. One field forester must be assigned to each county.

Sec. 4. 12 MRSA §8612, sub-§4, as enacted by PL 1989, c. 555, §8, is amended to read:

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4. Reporting requirements. The commissioner shall report biannually-beginning-in-1991, to the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over energy--and--natural resources forestry matters on activities under the field forester program. This report, to be completed by February 1st of each odd-numbered year, shall must include a description of the types of assistance given to landowners and wood processors, a description of the activities of the field foresters and any recommendations for changes in the program.'

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Further amend the amendment on page 6 by inserting before the first indented paragraph the following:
