

SENATE AMENDMENT "A " to COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P. 1390, L.D. 1892, Bill, "An Act to Implement the Compact for Maine's Forests"

Amend the amendment in section 14 in subsection 2 in paragraph B by striking out all of the 4th and 5th lines from the end (page 16, lines 12 and 13 in amendment) and inserting in their place the following: 'Notwithstanding any other provision of this section, traditional recreation activities, including, but not limited to, hunting, trapping and fishing, must be allowed on ecological forest reserves created pursuant to this section to the same extent that such uses existed before lands were designated as ecological forest reserves.'

SUMMARY

This amendment ensures that the right to enjoy traditional outdoor recreation activities on reserves continues to exist to the same extent as existed prior to the designation of the lands as reserves.
