SENATE AMENDMENT " B " to COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P.
1390, L.D. 1892, Bill, "An Act to Implement the Compact for
Maine's Forests"

Amend the amendment in section 14 in subsection 2 in
paragraph B by striking out all of the 4th and 5th lines from the
end (page 16, lines 12 and 13 in amendment) and inserting in
their place the following: 'Notwithstanding any other provision
of this section, traditional recreation activities, including,
but not limited to, hunting, trapping and fishing, must be
allowed on ecological forest reserves created pursuant to this
section to the same extent that such uses would be allowed on
those lands had they not been designated as ecological forest
reserves.'
