48 **Sec. B-1. Authorization to accept Federal Block Grant Funds.**
Effective October 1, 1996, the Department of Human Services may
50 accept Federal Block Grant Funds provided to the State under the
federal Personal Responsibility and Work Opportunity
52 Reconciliation Act of 1996, PL 104-193.

2 **Sec. B-2. Authorization to expend Federal Block Grant Funds.** The
3 Department of Human Services may expend Federal Block Grant Funds
4 provided to the State under the federal Personal Responsibility
5 and Work Opportunity Reconciliation Act of 1996 in accordance
6 with federal allocation levels previously authorized by the 117th
7 Legislature and in accordance with the Department of Human
8 Services rules existing on the effective date of this Part on
9 pass-through of child support funds. If the amount of block
10 grant funds received under the federal Personal Responsibility
11 and Work Opportunity Reconciliation Act of 1996, however, is
12 greater than the amount previously allocated by the 117th
13 Legislature, the additional amounts accrue in the federal
14 Personal Responsibility and Work Opportunity Reconciliation Act
15 of 1996 Block Grant account until allocation of these funds by
16 the Legislature.

18 **Sec. B-3. Compliance with federal law.** Notwithstanding any other
19 provision of law, the Department of Human Services shall comply
20 with all federal block grant funding restrictions under the
21 federal Personal Responsibility and Work Opportunity
22 Reconciliation Act of 1996. The department shall also expend
23 federal Personal Responsibility and Work Opportunity
24 Reconciliation Act of 1996 Federal Block Grant Funds within the
25 limitations of section 5 of this Part to maintain all state
26 welfare programs authorized on the effective date of this Part by
27 state laws and rules.

28 **Sec. B-4. Full implementation of the federal Personal Responsibility
29 and Work Opportunity Reconciliation Act of 1996.** The Department of
30 Human Services shall submit legislation proposing expenditures of
31 accrued federal Personal Responsibility and Work Opportunity
32 Reconciliation Act of 1996 Federal Block Grant Funds as referred
33 to in section 2 of this Part and any other related changes to
34 Maine's welfare programs to implement the federal Personal
35 Responsibility and Work Opportunity Act of 1996 to the
36 Legislature by April 1, 1997.

38 **Sec. B-5. Allocations.** The following funds are allocated from
39 the Federal Block Grant Funds under the federal Personal
40 Responsibility and Work Opportunity Reconciliation Act of 1996
41 Federal Block Grant for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1997 to
42 carry out the purposes of this Part.

SUMMARY

This bill allocates federal funds and Other Special Revenue funds to the Department of Human Services for the purpose of completing the Maine Automated Child Welfare Information System, MACWIS. The bill also clarifies a section of Public Law 1995, chapter 665, which restricts the use of Maximus-generated revenue, to authorize payment of costs of recovery, including contract fees.

This bill also authorizes the Department of Human Services to accept Federal Block Grant Funds under the federal Personal

2 Responsibility and Work Opportunity Reconciliation Act of 1996,
PL 104-193, for the purposes of continuing current state welfare
4 policy. The bill states that any additional funds accrued over
and above the amount previously allocated will accrue in the
6 federal Personal Responsibility and Work Opportunity
Reconciliation Act of 1996 Block Grant account. The bill directs
8 the Department of Human Services to maintain all existing state
welfare programs authorized by current state laws and rules,
10 including the rules on pass-through of child support funds and
legal immigrant families. The bill also directs the Department
12 of Human Services to submit legislation to the 118th Legislature
for the use of any additional federal Personal Responsibility and
14 Work Opportunity Reconciliation Act of 1996 funds and related
welfare program changes.
