16	2. The committee shall keep a transcript of all proceedings and shall make copies available as required in Title 3, chapter
18	21, subchapter II.
20	3. The committee shall, in all of its proceedings and in the handling of all materials submitted to the committee,
22	maintain the confidentiality of all materials protected by confidentiality granted by law, privilege or court order.
