An Act to Allow County Commissioners to Serve on the Maine Land Use Regulation Commission.

(EMERGENCY)

Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, there is no statutory provision that prevents 6 county commissioners from serving on the Maine Land Use Regulation Commission; and

Whereas, the Attorney General's office has recently submitted an opinion that county commissioners are prohibited from serving on the Maine Land Use Regulation Commission based on the common law doctrine of incompatibility; and

14 Whereas, until clarification of the law is provided, the law remains ambiguous; and

Whereas, it is in the best interest of the citizens of the 18 State that ambiguous laws be clarified as quickly as possible; and

20 Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of 22 Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and 24 safety; now, therefore,

Sec. 1. 12 MRSA §683, first ¶, as amended by PL 1995, c. 3, §2, is further amended to read:

The Maine Land Use Regulation Commission, as established by Title 5, section 12004-D, subsection 1 to carry out the purposes 32 stated in section 681, is created within the Department of Conservation, and in this chapter called the "commission." The 34 commission is charged with implementing this chapter in all of 36 the unorganized and deorganized areas of the State. The commission consists of 7 public members, none of whom may be 38 state employees, who must be appointed by the Governor, subject to review by the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over conservation matters and to confirmation 40 by the Legislature, for staggered 4-year terms. Among the public members, there must be 4 who must be knowledgeable in at least 42 one of each of the following areas: commerce and industry; 44 fisheries and wildlife; forestry; and conservation. Of the potential appointees to the commission, the Governor shall actively seek and give consideration to persons residing in or 46 near the unorganized areas of the State and to persons residing on unorganized coastal islands. 48 At least 2 members must be residents within the commission's jurisdiction. commissioners may serve on the commission if appointed pursuant to this section.
