An Act to Require That a Vacancy in the Office of Sheriff Be Filled by an Appointee from the Same Political Party.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1, 30-A MRSA §371-B is enacted to read:

<u>§371-B. Vacancies</u>

Vacancies in the office of sheriff caused by death, 8 resignation, removal from the county, permanent incapacity or any other reason must be filled as provided in the Constitution of 10 Maine. In the case of a vacancy in the term of a sheriff who was nominated by primary election before the general election, the sheriff appointed by the Governor to fill the vacancy until a 12 successor is chosen at election must be enrolled in the same political party as the sheriff whose term is vacant. In making 14the appointment, the Governor shall choose from any recommendations submitted to the Governor by the county committee 16 of the political party from which the appointment is made.

SUMMARY

This bill provides that in the case of a vacancy in the term of a sheriff who was nominated by primary election before the general election, the sheriff appointed by the Governor to fill the vacancy until a successor is chosen at election must be enrolled in the same political party as the sheriff whose term is vacant.
