RESOLUTION, Proposing an Amendment to the Constitution of Maine to Change the Process for the Selection of the State Treasurer.

Reference to the Committee on State and Local Government suggested and ordered printed.

Cosponsored by Representative DONNELLY of Presque Isle and Senators: FERGUSON of Oxford, GOLDTHWAIT of Hancock, HARRIMAN of Cumberland, KIEFFER of Aroostook, LIBBY of York, Representatives: FISK of Falmouth, GIERINGER of Portland. **Constitutional amendment. Resolved:** Two thirds of each branch of the Legislature concurring, that the following amendment to the Constitution of Maine be proposed:

6 **Constitution, Art. V, Part Third, §1** is repealed and the 6 following enacted in its place:

8 Section 1. Appointment. The Treasurer of State is appointed by the Governor for a 4-year term, subject to 10 confirmation by a 2/3 majority of the Legislature voting in convention by a joint ballot of Senators and Representatives.

; and be it further

- 16 **Constitutional referendum procedure; form of question; effective date. Resolved:** That the municipal officers of this State shall 18 notify the inhabitants of their respective cities, towns and plantations to meet, in the manner prescribed by law for holding 20 a statewide election, at a statewide election, on the Tuesday following the first Monday of November following the passage of 22 this resolution, to vote upon the ratification of the amendment proposed in this resolution by voting upon the following question: 24
 - "Do you favor amending the Constitution of Maine to provide that the Treasurer of State be appointed by the Governor subject to confirmation by the Legislature?"
- The legal voters of each city, town and plantation shall vote by ballot on this question and designate their choice by a 30 cross or check mark placed within the corresponding square below the word "Yes" or "No." The ballots must be received, sorted, 32 counted and declared in open ward, town and plantation meetings and returns made to the Secretary of State in the same manner as 34 votes for members of the Legislature. The Governor shall review the returns and, if it appears that a majority of the legal votes 36 are cast in favor of the amendment, the Governor shall proclaim that fact without delay and the amendment becomes part of the 38 Constitution on the date of the proclamation; and be it further

Secretary of State shall prepare ballots. Resolved: That the Secretary of State shall prepare and furnish to each city, town and plantation all ballots, returns and copies of this resolution necessary to carry out the purpose of this referendum.
