Sec. 1. 29-A MRSA §2251, sub-§4, ¶B, as enacted by PL 1993, c. 683, Pt. A, §2 and affected by Pt. B, §5, is amended to read:

B. Within 5 days from the time of notification of the accident, transmit a written report containing all available information to the Chief of the State Police except that this report may not contain the name or date of birth of any law enforcement officer if the accident involved an officer who was operating a motor vehicle in the course and scope of the officer's employment.
