An Act to Provide for the Position of President of the University of Maine System.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows: 2 Sec. 1. 10 MRSA §918, sub-§3, as corrected by RR 1995, c. 2, §19, is amended to read: 4 Ex officio corporators. Sec. 8. P&SL 1865, c. 532, §4-A, as amended by PL 1987, c. 20, §3, is repealed and the following enacted in its place:

16 Section 4-A. Administration: president, vice-presidents: advisory committees. The board of trustees shall appoint one person as president of the combined campuses. The president of the combined campuses may not serve concurrently as a member of the board of trustees. The board of trustees shall appoint one vice-president for each campus to assist the president with the day-to-day operation of each individual campus and the development of the academic program of each campus. The board of trustees shall appoint advisory committees on behalf of the various campuses and other advisory committees as necessary.

Section 4-B. Duties of the board of trustees and heads of the various campuses.

Board of trustees; duties. The board of trustees, --in
ebnsultation-with-the-chancellor, --shall-be is the governing and
planning body of the university and in-addition-shall-have has
the responsibility for preparing and approving the operating and
capital budgets of the university and presenting them in
accordance with the direction in the Maine Revised Statutes,
Title 5, section 1665, and Title 5, chapter 153.

SUMMARY

This bill eliminates the position and office of the 14 Chancellor of the University of Maine System, eliminates the position of president for each campus and instead provides for 16 one president for the combined campuses. To accomplish this, the bill:

 Removes the chancellor from the list of ex officio
corporators of the Board of Directors of the Maine Development Foundation;

 Repeals the provision requiring the chancellor to
present an address on the state of the University of Maine System to the Legislature;

Repeals the provision establishing a committee,
appointed by the chancellor, whose reporting and implementation dates have passed;

4. Replaces the chancellor with a member representing the 32 Board of Trustees of the University of Maine System on the New England Board of Higher Education;

5. Removes a reference to the chancellor in the laws 36 concerning University of Maine System labor relations;

38 6. Requires the board of trustees rather than the chancellor to appoint a member to the State Board of Substance
40 Abuse Counselors and a member to the Board of Counseling Professionals Licensure; and
