Under current law, a candidate who fails to file a campaign report with the Commission on Governmental Ethics and Election Practices in a timely manner is subject to civil and criminal penalties prescribed in Maine Revised Statutes, Title 21-A, section 1020-A. This bill will also subject a candidate for State Senator or State Representative to removal of the candidate's name from the general election ballot if the candidate has not filed required preprimary and post-primary campaign finance reports at least 60 days before the general election.

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
