6	offense under chapter 11 may be placed on probation for a period
	not to exceed 12 years for a Class A crime; not to exceed 8 years
8	for a Class B or Class C crime; and not to exceed 2 years for a
	Class D or Class E crime.
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	SUMMARY
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	The bill doubles the otherwise allowable period of probation
16	for a person convicted of an offense under the Maine Revised
	Statutes, Title 17-A, chapter 11.
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
