An Act to Reduce the Meal Allowance for Legislators from \$32 to \$16.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. 3 MRSA §2, 3rd and 10th $\P\P$, as amended by PL 1989, c. 878, Pt. D, $\S\S14$ and 15, are further amended to read:

Each member of the Senate and House of Representatives shall be is entitled to a meal allowance in the amount of \$32 \$16 and a housing allowance in the amount of \$38 for each day in attendance at sessions of the Legislature and for each day the member occupies overnight accommodations away from home either immediately preceding or immediately following attendance daily sessions of the Legislature. In lieu of the meal and housing allowance, each member shall-be is entitled to a daily meal allowance in the amount of \$32 \$16 and actual daily mileage allowances in an amount up to but not exceeding \$38 per day. Each member of the Senate shall also receive receives an annual allowance for constituent services in the amount of \$1,000, \$650 of which shall--be is received at the start of each regular session and \$350 of which shall--be is received in the month following adjournment of the regular session. Each member of the House of Representatives shall also receive receives an annual allowance for constituent services in the amount of \$750, \$500 of which shall-be is received at the start of each regular session and \$250 of which shall-be is received in the month following adjournment of the regular session.

The President of the Senate, the Speaker of the House of Representatives, the floor leaders and their assistants members of a committee, with the approval of the President of the Senate or the Speaker of the House of Representatives as to members of a committee, may also meet on days when Legislature is not in daily session at any convenient location State. Each member of the Senate and House within the Representatives shall--receive receives \$55 for every day's attendance when meetings or daily sessions are held, a meal allowance in the amount of \$32 \$16 and a housing allowance whereby by which actual lodging expenses will be reimbursed at the single-room rate, provided-that if a receipt is submitted to the Executive Director of the Legislative Council for each day in attendance at such meetings or daily sessions and for each day that member occupies overnight accommodations away from home either immediately preceding or immediately following attendance at daily sessions of the Legislature and actual daily mileage allowances which shall-be are paid at the same rate paid to state employees. In lieu of the meal and housing allowance, each member shall-be is entitled to a daily meal allowance in the amount of \$32 \$16 and actual daily mileage allowances.
