

**An Act to Exempt Seasonal Golf Course Employees from the
Unemployment Compensation Laws.**

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

2 **Sec. 1. 26 MRSA §1043, sub-§11, ¶F**, as corrected by RR 1995, c.
4 2, §62, is amended by amending subparagraphs (38) and (39) to
6 read:

8 (38) Services performed by a person licensed as a
10 guide as required by Title 12, section 7311, as long as
12 that employment is not subject to federal unemployment
14 tax; and

16 (39) Services performed by a direct seller as defined
18 in 26 United States Code, Section 3508, Subsection (b),
20 Paragraph (2). This subparagraph does not include a
22 person selling major improvements or renovations to the
24 structure of a home, business or property; and

26 **Sec. 2. 26 MRSA §1043, sub-§11, ¶F**, as corrected by RR 1995, c.
28 2, §62, is amended by adding a new subparagraph (40) to read:

30 (40) Services performed in the employ of a golf course
that operates for 6 or fewer months in any calendar
year.

SUMMARY

This bill exempts from the definition of "employment" for
unemployment compensation purposes persons who work at golf
courses that operate for 6 or fewer months a year.
