#### Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

### Sec. 1. 20-A MRSA §15653, sub-§5 is enacted to read:

5. Unexpended balances. Any unexpended balances from amounts appropriated for general purpose aid for local schools may not lapse but must be carried forward for the same purpose. If the carried amount for any year exceeds \$1,000,000, the Commissioner of Education shall propose rules that distribute the total amount of these funds to school administrative units. These rules are major substantive rules and are subject to legislative review in accordance with Title 5, chapter 375, subchapter II-A.

#### **SUMMARY**

This bill requires that when unexpended year-end balances from appropriations to general purpose aid for local schools exceed \$1,000,000, the Commissioner of Education must propose rules that distribute these balances back to schools.
