1	4 not renew their licenses as a result of lower demand. These factors can not be estimated at this time.

2	This amendment repeals the original bill. The amendment exempts a person from taking an approved driver education course
2	2 if the person resides 15 miles or more from the closest place that offers a driver education course, the person takes a written
2	examination before being issued a learner's permit and the person receives driver training from a parent or guardian who obtains a
2	6 waiver from the Secretary of State.
