Resolve, to Create a Task Force to Study the Adequacy of the Laws Regarding Involuntary Commitment.

Resolved: That there is created the Task Force to Study the Adequacy of the Laws Regarding Involuntary Commitment, referred to in this resolve as the "task force"; and be it further

- 6 Sec. 2. Membership. Resolved: That the task force consists of 9 members, appointed as follows:
- One member from the Office of the Attorney General,
 appointed by the Governor;
- 12 2. One member from the Department of Mental Health, Mental Retardation and Substance Abuse Services, appointed by the 14 Governor;
- 3. Three members that are either psychiatrists or psychologists, one member appointed by the Governor, one member appointed by the President of the Senate and one member appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives;
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Two members representing lawyers from the private
 sector, one member appointed by the President of the Senate and
 one member appointed by the Speaker of the House of
 Representatives; and

- 5. Two members who are providers of mental health services, one member appointed by the President of the Senate and one member appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives; and be it further
- Sec. 3. Appointments. Resolved: That all appointments must be made no later than 30 days following the effective date of this 32 The appointing authorities shall notify the Executive resolve. 34 Legislative Council upon making Director of thetheir appointments. When the appointment of all members is complete, the Chair of the Legislative Council shall call and convene the 36 first meeting of the task force no later than October 15, 1997. 38 The task force shall select a chair from among its members; and be it further

Sec. 4. Duties. Resolved: That the task force shall examine the involuntary commitment procedures for persons with mental illness who exhibit dangerous or violent behavior. In examining this issue, the task force shall review involuntary commitment procedures that are employed by other states; and be it further

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Sec. 5. Staff assistance. Resolved: That the task force shall request staffing and clerical assistance from the Legislative Council; and be it further Sec. 6. Compensation. Resolved: That the members who are not employees of the State or Legislators are entitled to per diem and expenses equal to the legislative per diem and expenses; and be it further

Sec. 7. Report. Resolved: That the task force shall submit its report and any necessary legislation to the Second Regular Session of the 118th Legislature by January 1, 1998.

12 If the task force requires an extension, it may apply to the 12 Legislative Council, which may grant the extension.

SUMMARY

This resolve creates the Task Force to Study the Adequacy of the Laws Regarding Involuntary Commitment. The study pertains to persons with mental illness who exhibit dangerous or violent behavior. The task force must submit its report and any necessary legislation to the Second Regular Session of the 118th Legislature.

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
