Resolve, Establishing the Commission to Review the Effectiveness of Statewide Confidentiality Laws Dealing with the Care of People with Mental Illness.

Resolved: That the Commission to Review the Effectiveness of Statewide Confidentiality Laws 4 Dealing with the Care of People with Mental Illness, referred to in this resolve as the "commission," is established; and be it 6 further

Sec. 2. Membership. Resolved: That the commission consists of 7 members, appointed as follows:

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Two members from the Department of the Attorney General,
one chosen by the Governor and one chosen by the President of the Senate;

2. Two members representing lawyers from the private 16 sector, one chosen by the Governor and one chosen by the Speaker of the House;

Two members who are providers of mental health services,
one chosen by the President of the Senate and one chosen by the
Speaker of the House; and

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 One member from the Department of Mental Health, Mental
Retardation and Substance Abuse to be chosen by the Governor; and be it further

Sec. 3. Appointments. Resolved: That all appointments must be made no later than 30 days following the effective date of this 28 resolve. The appointing authorities shall notify the Executive Legislative 30 Director of the Council upon makinq their When the appointment of all members is complete, appointments. the Chair of the Legislative Council shall call and convene the 32 first meeting of the commission no later than October 15, 1997. The commission shall select a chair from among its members; and 34 be it further

Sec. 4. Duties. Resolved: That the commission shall examine what, if any, information should be kept confidential as it pertains to the care of people with mental illness. In examining this issue, the commission shall review methods that are employed by other states as it pertains to the confidentiality of the care of people with mental illness; and be it further

44 Sec. 5. Staff assistance. Resolved: That the commission shall request staffing and clerical assistance from the Legislative 46 Council; and be it further

48 Sec. 6. Compensation. Resolved: That the members who are neither employees of the State nor Legislators are entitled to a 50 per diem and expenses equal to the legislative per diem and expenses; and be it further

Sec. 7. Report. Resolved: That the commission shall submit 2 its report with any accompanying legislation to the Second 4 Regular Session of the 118th Legislature by January 1, 1998. 6 If the commission requires an extension, it may apply to the Legislative Council, which may grant the extension. 8 **SUMMARY** 10 12 This resolve creates a study commission to review the effectiveness of statewide confidentiality laws dealing with the care of people with mental illness. The commission must submit 14its report and any accompanying legislation to the Second Regular 16Session of the 118th Legislature.
