An Act to Amend the Criteria for Reimbursement by the Medicaid Program for Nursing Facility Residents.

Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, current regulations for Medicaid reimbursement for residency in a nursing facility that were adopted in 1993 made 6 some residents ineligible after they had already established residency in nursing facilities; and 8

Whereas, residents who have been disqualified under the 10 current regulations for Medicaid reimbursement are living in uncertainty and may be paying their own expenses or receiving 12 assistance from their families, at great hardship to them and 14their families; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts 16create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately 18 necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and 20 safety; now, therefore,

22 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

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Sec. 1. PL 1993, c. 410, Pt. F F, §15 is repealed.

26 Sec. 2. Medicaid program reimbursement criteria. By July 1, 1997, the Department of Human Services shall amend the medical criteria for reimbursement by the Medicaid program for residents 28 of nursing facilities. The criteria must:

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1. Target nursing facility admissions to applicants who can 32 not be served in less restrictive settings;

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applicants being advised of home Result in and community-based services that are available and referred to services that are cost-effective and clinically appropriate; and

Apply to residents of a nursing facility who were 3. 38 residents on June 30, 1993 the same standards for medical eligibility that were in effect on June 30, 1993. 40

Sec. 3. Application; retroactivity. This applies 42 Act retroactively to all determinations of medical eligibility for reimbursement by the Medicaid program for residents of nursing 44 facilities on or after July 1, 1993.

Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this Act takes effect when approved. 48

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## SUMMARY

This bill requires the Department of Human Services to amend the medical criteria for reimbursement by the Medicaid program for residents of nursing facilities. For residents who were residents on June 30, 1993, the criteria must be the same as the criteria in effect on that date. The bill applies retroactively to all determinations of eligibility for admission on or after July 1, 1993.

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
