22	Amend the bill by striking everything after the enacting clause and before the summary and inserting in its place the
24	following:
26	'Sec. 1. Transfer. Ten thousand dollars in fiscal year 1997-98 and \$10,000 in fiscal year 1998-99 are transferred from
28	the Carrying Balances-Inland Fisheries and Wildlife Program to the Bureau of Resource Management in the Department of Inland
30	Fisheries and Wildlife for coyote control. These funds are provided to supplement existing resources budgeted by the
32	department for coyote control and must be used to control coyotes in and around deer yards. The commissioner shall submit a report
34	to the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over inland fisheries and wildlife matters no later
36	than April 1, 1999 on the total expenditures in the fiscal years 1997-98 and 1998-99 on coyote control and the effectiveness of
.38	those expenditures on rebuilding the deer herd.'
40	Further amend the bill by inserting at the end before the summary the following:
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44	FISCAL NOTE
46	The transfer of funds from the Carrying Balances-Inland
48	Fisheries and Wildlife program to the Resource Management Services-Inland Fisheries and Wildlifeprogram within the Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife will increase

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available General Fund resources in the Resource Management
Services-Inland Fisheries and Wildlife program for additional coyote control by \$10,000 annually in fiscal years 1997-98 and 1998-99.

6 The Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife will incur some minor additional costs to submit a required report to the 8 Legislature. These costs can be absorbed within the department's existing budgeted resources.'

SUMMARY

This is the majority report of the Joint Standing Committee on Inland Fisheries and Wildlife.

This amendment replaces the bill. The amendment transfers \$10,000 in each fiscal year of the upcoming biennium from the Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife's carrying account to that department's Bureau of Resource Management for the purpose of supplementing existing resources budgeted for the control of 22 coyotes.

24 The amendment also requires that Commissioner of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife to report to the joint standing committee 26 of the Legislature having jurisdiction over inland fisheries and wildlife matters by April 1, 1999 on the total expenditures by 28 the department for coyote control and the effectiveness of those expenditures on rebuilding the deer herd.
