Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. 12 MRSA §7035, sub-§3, ¶B, as enacted by PL 1985, c. 408, §2, is amended to read:

B. Agents shall must be trained in the use of snares and shall-be deployed in the unorganized townships to control coyotes during the winter months. All snaring shall must be carried out under-the-direction-of-department-officials-and with the knowledge of the local game warden. All areas of snaring activity shall must be adequately posted.

Sec. 2. 12 MRSA §7035, sub-§3, ¶D is enacted to read:

D.The commissioner shall ensure that at least 50% of the16department's annual expenditures on animal damage control is
spent on coyote control and that at least 75% of the annual18expenditures on coyote control is spent in those areas of
the State identified by the department as areas where the
control of coyotes will be most effective in rebuilding the
deer herd.

SUMMARY

26 This bill provides that animal damage control agents need not be under the direction of officials from the Department of 28 Inland Fisheries and Wildlife when using snares.

The bill also requires that at least 50% of the department's animal damage control expenditures be spent to control coyotes
and at least 75% of the coyote control money be spent in areas of the State where, in the department's opinion, coyote control will
be most effective in rebuilding the deer herd.
