An Act to Limit Medicaid Coverage for Methadone Rehabilitation to One Year.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. 5 MRSA $\S20053$, sub- $\S3$, as enacted by PL 1995, c. 499, $\S1$ and affected by $\S5$, is amended to read:

Project limitation. Participation in the project is limited to 300 clients at any one time receiving long-term methadone and other narcotic drug detoxification and maintenance treatment for narcotic dependency, of whom a maximum of 100 at any one time may receive the treatment under reimbursement from the Medicaid program. Clients of a treatment program that is licensed in the State who are receiving methadone or other narcotic drug detoxification or maintenance treatment on the date of the commencement of the treatment project have priority as clients under the treatment project. <u>Clients must receive a</u> minimum of 1/2 hour of counseling time per week. Treatment under the treatment project for persons receiving reimbursement under the Medicaid program must be cost-neutral or result in savings to the Medicaid program. Treatment under the treatment project for persons receiving reimbursement under the Medicaid program is limited to one year per person.

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SUMMARY

This bill limits treatment under the long-term narcotic dependency treatment project for persons receiving reimbursement under the Medicaid program to one year per person and provides a minimum of 1/2 hour of counseling time per week per person.
