An Act to Provide Financial Incentives to a Company That Hires and Provides Health Insurance Benefits to a Medicaid Recipient.

## Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows: 2 Sec. 1. 22 MRSA §3741-G, sub-§7 is enacted to read: 4 7. Health care benefit reimbursement. An employer that 6 hires a recipient of transitional medical assistance benefits and provides health care benefits that meet the following requirements to that employee is entitled to reimbursement 8 according to this subsection. 10 The health care benefits must be similar to or more Α. 12 comprehensive than the benefits provided under the Medicaid program. 14B. Reimbursement is limited to the lesser of the cost to the State for coverage under the Medicaid program or the 16 employer's share of the health care benefit premium. 18 C. Reimbursement is limited to the time period during which 20 the employee would have been eligible for continued transitional medical assistance benefits under this section. 22 D. The commissioner shall adopt rules to implement this subsection. Rules adopted pursuant to this subsection are 24 major substantive rules as defined in Title 5, chapter 375, subchapter II-A. 26 28 **SUMMARY** 30

This bill provides for reimbursement of health care benefit 32 costs to employers that hire recipients of transitional medical assistance under the Medicaid program. The Commissioner of Human 34 Services is required to adopt rules to implement the reimbursement provision.
