	1. Appointment of agent. The appointment of one or more
	gents to vote on behalf of the member must be by written proxy
	xecuted by the member or by the member's duly authorized
	ttorney-in-fact. A telegram, cablegram or facsimile appearing
	o have been transmitted may be considered to satisfy this
r	equirement.
	2. Duration. A proxy is valid for only 11 months from the
	ate of its execution, unless otherwise expressly and
C	onspicuously provided in the proxy.
	3. Revocation. A proxy is revocable at the pleasure of the
	erson executing it. A proxy may be revoked, without limitation,
	y an instrument that in terms revokes the proxy or by a
	ubsequent duly executed proxy. The authority of a proxy holder
	s not revoked by death or supervening incapacity of the member
	xecuting the proxy unless, before the authority is exercised,
	ritten notice of death or incapacity is filed with the corporate
	fficer responsible for maintaining the list of members. The
	resence at a members' meeting of the member appointing a proxy
	oes not of itself revoke the proxy. A member may revoke an
	ppointment of a proxy by giving notice to the corporate officer
	esponsible for maintaining a list of members or by giving notice
1	n open meeting of the members.
	SUMMARY
	This bill removes the prohibition on members of cooperatives
v	oting by proxy. The bill allows a cooperative to prohibit
	oting by proxy in the articles of incorporation or bylaws. If a coperative does not prohibit voting by proxy in its articles of
	ncorporation or hylaws members of the cooperative may wote by

proxy.
