Further amend the bill by inserting at the end before the summary the following:

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## ·FISCAL NOTE

Allowing a school administrative unit to count students participating in equivalent instruction programs as full time equivalent students according to the number of hours of on-site academic services they receive from the units will increase allocations for these students within General Purpose Aid for Local Schools by approximately \$620,000 annually beginning in fiscal year 1997-98. This bill does not include additional funding for these increased costs. As a result, school subsidies will be redistributed from school units that do not have students participating in equivalent instruction programs to those that do.'

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## SUMMARY

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This amendment allows school units to be reimbursed participating proportionally for students in equivalent instruction programs who receive any on-site academic services provided by their local school units. The amendment further classifies such students as full-time equivalent according to the number of hours they receive on-site academic services at a public school. School units are required to keep accurate records and report full-time equivalency enrollment. The amendment also adds a fiscal note.

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
