An Act to Require a Revote by Referendum on a School Budget and to Clarify the Budget Referendum Approval Process.

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- Sec. 1. 20-A MRSA $\S1305$, sub- $\S2$, as amended by PL 1993, c. 372, $\S1$, is further amended to read:
- 6 2. Application. Following the board of director's directors' declaration that the article has passed, the board shall cause the voting at all future district budget meetings and 8 to be called within each municipality within the district. voting must be held in accordance with the procedures set out in 10 sections 1351 to 1354, except that the warrant and absentee ballots for the meeting must be prepared and distributed to the 12 municipal clerks at least 14 days prior to the date of the 14 referendum. The board may hold informational meetings on voting procedure and budget prior to voting. The board shall-be is responsible for the form of the articles to be voted on in the 16 municipalities, except as otherwise provided by law. The board 18 may include in the warrant an explanation of the relationship between warrant articles authorizing specific line item expenditures prescribed in section 1307, subsection 1 and the 20 articles prescribed in chapter 606 summarizing the budget 22 proposal.
- Sec. 2. 20-A MRSA §1305, sub-§3, as amended by PL 1993, c. 372, §2, is further amended to read:
- Failure to approve a budget. If the budget or a portion of the budget fails to receive a majority vote at the referendum, 28 the board of directors shall deeide--in--a--publie--proceeding 30 whether-subsequent-votes-on-the-portion-of-the-budget-that-was defeated--must--be--conducted submit to a revote, changed or 32 unchanged, the portion of the budget that was defeated in accordance with the referendum procedure in subsection 2 er-at-a district-budget-meeting-held-at-a-single-place-in-the-district-in 34 accordance-with-procedures-in-sections-1303-and-1304 , up to 2 times, until an alternative budget is adopted. 36 Subsequent votes conducted in accordance with the referendum procedure subsection 2 must be held within 45 days. 38 Subsequent--vetes eendueted-in-accordance-with-sections-1303-and-1304-must-be-held These referenda or-meetings must be held solely 40 within-30-days. for the purpose of approving an alternative operating school 42 budget to replace the part of the proposed budget that the voters failed to approve. The-board-may-continue-in-this-manner-until 44 an-alternative-budget-is-adepted If the portion of the budget that failed to receive a majority vote includes a summary article prescribed in chapter 606, that portion of the budget may be 46 resubmitted for revote accompanied by a written explanation of the relationship between the warrant articles authorizing 48 specific line item expenditures and the articles prescribed in 50 chapter 606 summarizing the budget proposal. If, after 2 revotes by referendum, that portion of the budget that failed to receive

a majority vote still fails to pass by a majority, it must be funded at the level of funding authorized in the previous year.

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SUMMARY

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This bill will allow school districts to clarify the relationship between the warrant articles authorizing specific line item expenditures and the warrant articles summarizing the 3 major types of expenditures. The purpose of the bill is to correct the situation that arises when voters approve the specific line item expenditures but not the overall school budget.
