	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
2	Sec. 1. 12 MRSA §7406, sub-§22 is enacted to read:

	22. Hunting without guide. A person commits the offense of
6	hunting without a guide if that person:
8	A. Is a nonresident alien; and
10	B. Hunts while not accompanied by a guide licensed pursuant
	to section 7311 or hunts accompanied by a licensed guide if
12	the total number of clients of that guide during the hunt
	exceeds 3 persons.

	The commissioner, upon application of a nonresident alien for any
16	license to hunt, shall make appropriate determinations with
	regard to the applicability of this subsection and, if this
18	subsection applies, shall stamp any license issued to the
	applicant with the words "GUIDE REQUIRED."

22	SUMMARY
24	Under this bill a nonresident alien is required to be
	accompanied by a guide while hunting in this State. Persons who
26	fall within this requirement may jointly hire a guide, provided
	that the total number of clients for any one guide does not
28	exceed 3 persons.
30	Violation of this requirement is a Class E crime by

operation of the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 12, section 7901.
