2 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

4 Sec. 1. 1 MRSA §1024 is enacted to read:

6 §1024. Former Legislators; prohibition on employment

8 A former Legislator may not be employed in the legislative,
10 judicial or executive branch of government in any capacity until
12 2 years after the last day of the most recent legislative term of
14 office for which the Legislator was elected. This prohibition
16 applies to both partisan and nonpartisan employment.

18 SUMMARY

20 This bill prohibits the employment in the legislative,
judicial or executive branch of a former Legislator until 2 years
after the most recent legislative term for which the Legislator
was elected.
