	§1024. Former Legislators; prohibition on employment
	A former Legislator may not be employed in the legislative
	judicial or executive branch of government in any capacity until
1	2 years after the last day of the most recent legislative term of
9	office for which the Legislator was elected. This prohibition
1	applies to both partisan and nonpartisan employment.
