Resolve, to Establish Qualifications for Constitutional Officers.

Presented by Senator LIBBY of York. Cosponsored by Senator MacKINNON of York, Representative: GERRY of Auburn. Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts and resolves of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

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Whereas, the review proposed by this resolve must be initiated before the 90-day period expires in order that the review may be completed and a report submitted in time for the next legislative session; and

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Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore, be it

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Sec. 1. Commission established. Resolved: That the Commission to Establish the Criteria and Qualifications for Certain State Officers, referred to in this resolve as the "commission," is established; and be it further

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Sec. 2. Commission membership. Resolved: That the commission consists of the following 11 members: the Secretary of State or a designee; the Attorney General or a designee; the Treasurer of State or a designee; the State Auditor or a designee; one Senator, appointed by the President of the Senate; 2 members of the House of Representatives, appointed by the Speaker of the Representatives; and 4 members appointed by House of possible, who must, so far as be members Governor, professional organizations directly involved in the activities regulated by or associated with one or more of the state officers persons with professional experience in an area of governmental, commercial, legal or other activity regulated by or associated with one or more of the state officers; and be it further

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Sec. 3. Appointments; meetings. Resolved: That all appointments must be made no later than 30 days following the effective date of this resolve. The Executive Director of the Legislative Council must be notified by all appointing authorities once the selections have been made. When appointment of all members has been completed, the Chair of the Legislative Council shall call and convene the first meeting of the commission no later than August 1, 1997. The commission shall select a chair from among its members; and be it further

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Sec. 4. Definition. Resolved: That, as used in this resolve, "state officers" means the Secretary of State, the Attorney General, the Treasurer of State and the State Auditor; and be it further

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	Sec. 5. Duties. Resolved: That the commission shall:

6	2. Examine the educational, experiential and professional certification or licensing requirements necessary for performing

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22	In carrying out its review, the commission shall hold at least one public hearing; and be it further
24	Sec. 6. Staff assistance. Resolved: That the Legislative Council shall provide staffing assistance for the commission; and be it

28	Sec. 7. Compensation. Resolved: That members of the commission who are Legislators are entitled to receive
30	legislative per diem and members who are not state employees are entitled to receive reimbursement for travel and other necessary
32	expenses related to performance of their duties upon application to the Executive Director of the Legislative Council; and be it

36	Sec. 8. Report. Resolved: That the commission shall submit
38	its report, together with any necessary implementing legislation, to the Second Regular Session of the 118th Legislature and the Joint Standing Committee on State and Local Government no later
40	than November 1, 1997.
<b>42</b>	Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this resolve takes effect when approved.
