2	Sec. 1. 12 MRSA §8869, sub-§11, as enacted by PL 1989, c. 555,
4	§10, is repealed.
6	Sec. 2. 12 MRSA §8869, sub-§13 is enacted to read:
8	13. Search warrant required. An agent of the bureau shall
	obtain an administrative search warrant before entry onto private
10	property for the purpose of determining compliance with the
	provisions of this chapter or rules adopted pursuant to this
12	chapter. A search warrant is not required if the agent has the
	consent of the landowner to enter onto the property.

18	This bill requires agents of the Department of Conservation,
	Bureau of Forestry to obtain a search warrant prior to entering
20	onto private land to investigate possible forest practices violations unless the agent has the consent of the landowner.
