Resolve, Authorizing Robert O'Malley to Sue the State.

Reference to the Committee on Legal and Veterans Affairs suggested and ordered printed.

Presented by Representative TOWNSEND of Portland. Cosponsored by Senator ABROMSON of Cumberland and Representative MUSE of South Portland, Senator: RAND of Cumberland. Sec. 1. Robert O'Malley; authorized to sue the State. Resolved: That, notwithstanding any statutes or common laws to the contrary, Robert O'Malley, who claims to have suffered damages as a result of prosecution by the Department of the Attorney General, is authorized to bring suit against the State and against individual past and present employees of the Department of the Attorney General who are covered by a liability.

This action must be brought within one year from the passage of this resolve in the Cumberland County Superior Court. Liability and damages including punitive damages must be determined according to state law, as in litigation between individuals.

Any judgment costs and interest that may be recovered in this civil action are payable from the State Treasury within 30 days of an execution being issued by the Cumberland County Superior Court. Recovery may not exceed \$250,000, including costs against the State, and may not exceed the amount of liability insurance coverage of individual employees of the Department of the Attorney General. Hearing must be before a Justice of the Superior Court, with or without jury. The action is governed by the Maine Rules of Civil Procedure.

SUMMARY

This resolve authorizes Robert O'Malley to sue the State and individual past and present employees of the Department of the Attorney General who are covered by a liability insurance policy or policies. The resolve authorizes Robert O'Malley to recover damages up to \$250,000.
