RESOLUTION, Proposing an Amendment to the Constitution of Maine to Require a Runoff Election if No Candidate Receives a Majority of the Votes in the General Election.

Constitutional amendment. Resolved: Two thirds of each branch of the Legislature concurring, that the following amendment to the Constitution of Maine be proposed:

Constitution, Art. V, Part First, §3 is amended to read:

Section 3. Election; votes to be returned to Secretary of State; Secretary of State to lay lists before the Senate and 8 House of Representatives; provision in case of tie. The meetings for election of Governor shall be notified, held and regulated 10 and votes shall be received, sorted, counted and declared and in the manner as those for Senators and 12 recorded, same Representatives. Copies of lists of votes shall be sealed and returned to the secretary's office in the same manner and at the 14 same time as those for Senators. The Secretary of State for the 16 time being shall, on the first Wednesday after the first Tuesday of January then next, lay the lists returned to the secretary's office before the Senate and House of Representatives to be by 18 them examined, together with the ballots cast if they so elect, 20 and they shall determine the number of votes duly cast for the office of Governor, and in ease of a choice by plurality of all of - the - votes - returned - they - shall - declare - and - publish - the - same . 22 If no person received more than 50% of the votes duly cast for the office of Governor, the Senate and House of Representatives, 24 meeting in joint session, shall order a runoff election to be held within 2 weeks between the 2 persons who received the 26 largest number of votes duly cast for the office of Governor. The person who receives the larger number of votes in the runoff 28 election is declared the Governor. If there shall be a tie between the 2 persons having-the-largest-number-of-votes-for 30 Governor in the runoff election, the House of Representatives and the Senate meeting in joint session, and each member of said 32 bodies having a single vote, shall elect one of said 2 persons having so received an equal number of votes and the person so 34 elected by the Senate and House of Representatives shall be 36 declared the Governor.

40 Constitutional referendum procedure; form of question; effective date. Resolved: That the municipal officers of this State shall 42 notify the inhabitants of their respective cities, towns and plantations to meet, in the manner prescribed by law for holding 44 a statewide election, at a statewide election, on the Tuesday following the first Monday of November following the passage of 46 this resolution, to vote upon the ratification of the amendment proposed in this resolution by voting upon the following question: 48

Page 1-LR1918(1)

"Do you favor amending the Constitution of Maine to require a runoff election if no candidate receives a majority of the votes in the general election for the office of Governor?"

The legal voters of each city, town and plantation shall vote by ballot on this question and designate their choice by a cross or check mark placed within the corresponding square below the word "Yes" or "No." The ballots must be received, sorted, counted and declared in open ward, town and plantation meetings and returns made to the Secretary of State in the same manner as votes for members of the Legislature. The Governor shall review the returns and, if it appears that a majority of the legal votes are cast in favor of the amendment, the Governor shall proclaim that fact without delay and the amendment becomes part of the Constitution on the date of the proclamation; and be it further

Secretary of State shall prepare ballots. Resolved: That the Secretary of State shall prepare and furnish to each city, town and plantation all ballots, returns and copies of this resolution necessary to carry out the purpose of this referendum.

SUMMARY

The purpose of this constitutional resolution is to amend the Constitution of Maine to require that successful candidates 26 for Governor receive more than 50% of the votes cast. Currently, receives the largest number 28 the candidate who of votes, regardless of that number's percentage of the total number of votes cast, becomes Governor. This resolution requires a runoff 30 election between the 2 persons who received the largest number of 32 votes when no candidate received a majority of more than 50% of the total number of votes cast. The person who receives the 34 larger number of votes in the runoff election is declared Governor.
