STATE OF MAINE SENATE 118TH LEGISLATURE FIRST SPECIAL SESSION

COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to S.P. 88, L.D. 268, Bill, "An Act to Authorize a General Fund Bond Issue in the Amount of \$20,000,000 for Landfill Closure and Remediation"

Amend the bill by striking out the title and substituting 24 the following:

 'An Act to Authorize a General Fund Bond Issue in the Amount of \$13,000,000 to Construct Water Pollution Control Facilities, to Close and Clean Up Municipal Solid Waste Landfills, to Clean Up Tire Stockpiles, to Mitigate Storm Water Pollution through a Comprehensive Watershed Protection Program and to Make Drinking Water Improvements'

Further amend the bill by striking out all of the preamble 34 (page 1, lines 1 to 6 in L.D.) and inserting in its place the following:

'Preamble. Two thirds of both Houses of the Legislature
deeming it necessary in accordance with the Constitution of Maine, Article IX, Section 14, to authorize the issuance of bonds
on behalf of the State of Maine to provide funds to construct water pollution control facilities, to close and clean up
municipal solid waste landfills, to clean up tire stockpiles, to mitigate storm water pollution through a comprehensive watershed
protection program and to make drinking water improvements.'

46 Further amend the bill by striking out all of sections 1, 5
and 6 (page 1, lines 10 to 20, lines 43 to 47 and page 2, lines 1
48 to 13 in L.D.) and inserting in their place the following:

'Sec. 1. Authorization of bonds to provide for funds to construct 2 water pollution control facilities, to close and clean up municipal solid 4 waste landfills, to clean up tire stockpiles, to mitigate storm water pollution through a comprehensive watershed protection program and to make 6 drinking water improvements. The Treasurer of State authorized, under the direction of the Governor, to issue bonds 8 in the name and on behalf of the State in an amount not exceeding \$13,000,000 to raise funds to construct water pollution control 10 facilities, to close and clean up municipal solid waste landfills, to clean up tire stockpiles, to mitigate storm water pollution through a comprehensive watershed protection program 12 and to make drinking water improvements as authorized by section 14 The bonds are a pledge of the full faith and credit of the 6. The bonds may not run for a period longer than 10 years State. from the date of the original issue of the bonds. 16 At the discretion of the Treasurer of State, with the approval of the Governor, any issuance of bonds may contain a call feature. 18

20 Sec. 5. Disbursement of bond proceeds. The proceeds of the bonds must be expended as set out in section 6 under the 22 direction and supervision of the Department of Environmental Protection and the Department of Human Services.

Sec. 6. Allocations from General Fund bond issue; to construct water pollution control facilities, to close and clean up municipal solid waste landfills, to clean up tire stockpiles, to mitigate storm water pollution through a comprehensive watershed protection program and make drinking water improvements. The proceeds of the sale of bonds must be expended as designated in the following schedule.

Further amend the bill in section 10 by striking out all of the question (page 2, lines 45 to 47 in L.D.) and inserting in its place the following:

"Do you favor a \$13,000,000 bond issue, which will match \$15,000,000 in federal funds, to construct water pollution control facilities, to close and clean up municipal solid waste landfills, to clean up tire stockpiles, to mitigate storm water pollution through a comprehensive watershed protection program and to make drinking water improvements?"

24 Further amend the bill by inserting at the end before the summary the following:

FISCAL NOTE

30 The estimated cost of sending this bond issue out to referendum will vary according to the total number of referenda 32 enacted during the First Special Session of the 118th Legislature to be submitted in November. The estimated cost to the Secretary 34 of State if one to 6 referenda are enacted is \$95,000. Each additional referendum costs an additional \$7,000.

If approved by the voters, the total cost of this bond issue is estimated to be \$16,646,500 with principal payments of \$13,000,000 and interest payments of approximately \$3,646,500.'

SUMMARY

44 This amendment reduces the amount of the bond issue to \$13,000,000.
