 COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P. 209, L.D. 273, "Resolve,
 20 Directing the Commissioner of Marine Resources to Negotiate with the Passamaquoddy Tribe Regarding Fishing Rights"

Amend the resolve by striking out the title and substituting 24 the following:

26 'Resolve, Directing the Commissioner of Marine Resources to Report on the Status of Discussions with the Passamaquoddy Tribe' 28

Further amend the resolve by striking out everything after 30 the title and before the summary and inserting in its place the following:

'Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts and resolves of the 34 Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, the Joint Standing Committee on Marine Resources has found it essential to receive a report by May 1, 1997 on discussions with the Passamaquoddy Tribe regarding the State's salt water licensing laws; and

42 Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of 44 Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and 46 safety; now, therefore, be it

48 Sec. 1. Commissioner to report. Resolved: That the Commissioner of Marine Resources, or the commissioner's designee, shall report
 50 by May 1, 1997 to the Joint Standing Committee on Marine Resources concerning the status of ongoing discussions

## COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P. 209, L.D. 273

between representatives of the Joint Tribal Council of the
Passamaquoddy Tribe and of the State of Maine with respect to the taking of marine resources by members of the Passamaquoddy Tribe,
including any proposed amendments to the laws administered by the Department of Marine Resources.

**Emergency clause.** In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this resolve takes effect when approved.'

#### **SUMMARY**

The amendment replaces the resolve. It requires the Commissioner of Marine Resources, or the commissioner's designee, to report to the Joint Standing Committee on Marine Resources by May 1, 1997 on the status of ongoing discussions between representatives of the Joint Tribal Council of the Passamaquoddy Tribe and of the State of Maine concerning the taking of marine resources by members of the Passamaquoddy Tribe, including any proposed amendments to the laws administered by the Department of Marine Resources.
