An Act to Meet Federal Requirements Regarding Collection of Bias Motivation Data through Uniform Crime Reporting.

#### Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. 25 MRSA §1544, 2nd ¶, as amended by PL 1991, c. 206, 4 §1 and affected by §2, is further amended to read:

The bureau shall establish a category for abuse by adults of 6 family or household members and a category for crimes that 8 manifest evidence of prejudice based on race, religion, disability, sexual orientation or ethnicity that are supplementary to its other reported information. The bureau 10 shall prescribe the information to be submitted in the same manner as for all other categories of the uniform crime reports. 12

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### **SUMMARY**

The federal Violent Crime and Law Enforcement Act of 1994 amended the Hate Crimes Statistics Act to include the collection of data using the Uniform Crime Reporting System about crimes that manifest evidence of prejudice based on disability. This bill brings the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 25, section 1544, which governs uniform crime reporting data collection by the State Police, into compliance with the federal requirement.

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
