Resolved: That the commission shall study the unemployment compensation program to assess whether it is meeting changing needs of the labor force and the business The commission shall examine community. the seasonality exclusion, disqualification of persons who lose work because of problems with child care or transportation, the timeliness of the extended benefit trigger, the adequacy of benefit duration in the benefit dislocated worker program, the solvency Unemployment Compensation Fund and the experience rating system, the disqualification of persons who seek part-time work, and minimum earnings thresholds; and be it further
  - Sec. 6. Reimbursement. Resolved: That the commission members who are Legislators are entitled to receive the legislative per diem, as defined in the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 3, section 2, for each day's attendance at meetings of the commission. Upon application to the Legislative Council, all members of the commission are entitled to reimbursement for travel and other necessary expenses. The Executive Director of the Legislative Council shall administer the commission's budget; and be it further
  - Sec. 7. Report. Resolved: That the commission shall submit a report to the Joint Standing Committee on Labor by February 1, 1998 with specific recommendations including legislation if necessary; and be it further
  - Sec. 8. Legislation. Resolved: That the Joint Standing Committee on Labor may report out legislation that the committee determines is necessary to address issues that the commission is required to study pursuant to section 5 of this resolve; and be it further
  - Sec. 9. Appropriation. Resolved: That the following funds are appropriated from the General Fund to carry out the purposes of this resolve.
