Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

4 **Sec. 1. 12 MRSA §7406, sub-§6**, as enacted by PL 1979, c. 420,
§1, is amended to read:

8 **6. Twilight hunting.** A person is guilty of twilight
hunting if he that person hunts wild animals, except raccoons as
provided in chapters 701 to 721, between 15 minutes after sunset
and 1/2 hour after sunset during the open firearm season on deer.
