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'Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts and resolves of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after 28 adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, in current practice, 3rd-party payors of health care benefits use multiple claims processing systems; and 32

Whereas, other jurisdictions have begun exploring the 34 feasibility of implementing a single claims processing system for all 3rd-party payors and are also exploring ways to streamline 36 claims processing; and

Whereas, it is necessary to begin the study of the feasibility of a single claims processing system or a more 40 streamlined system for 3rd-party payors of health care benefits 42 in this State; and

Whereas, the members of the task force established by this 44 resolve must be appointed prior to the expiration of the 90-day 46 period; and

48 Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of 50 Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and 52 safety; now, therefore, be it

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Sec. 1. Task force established. Resolved: That the Task Force to Study the Feasibility of a Single Claims Processing System for 2 3rd-party Payors of Health Care Benefits, referred to in this resolve as the "task force," is established to study 4 the feasibility of a streamlined claims processing system for 3rd-party payors of health care benefits and to study the б feasibility of a single claims processing system for 3rd-party payors of health care benefits; and be it further 8 Sec. 2. Task force membership. Resolved: That the task force 10 consists of 15 members appointed as follows: 12 One representative of the Maine Medical Association or 1. the Maine Osteopathic Association appointed by the Governor; 14 One Maine-based representative of the Health Insurance 16 2. Association of America appointed by the Governor; 18 3. One representative of Blue Cross and Blue Shield of Maine appointed by the Governor; 20 One representative of the Home Care Alliance of Maine 22 4. appointed by the Governor; 24 interests of independent 5. One representative of the occupational, physical and speech therapists appointed by the 26 Governor; 28 6. 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Sec. 4. Duties. Resolved: That the task force shall:

 Gather and examine information from other jurisdictions that have implemented a single claims processing system or have implemented a streamlined claims processing system;

 Identify barriers and problems that need to be addressed to implement a single claims processing system or to streamline
the current claims processing system;

3. Determine resources necessary to implement a single claims processing system or a streamlined system and develop a
model for a single claims processing system;

24 4. Determine the impact on health care providers and health insurance carriers in a single claims processing system or a
26 streamlined system; and

Identify the necessary steps for protecting the confidentiality of medical records and proprietary information in
a single claims processing system or a streamlined system; and be it further

Sec. 5. Staff assistance. Resolved: That the task force shall request staffing and clerical assistance from the Legislative Council; and be it further

Sec. 6. Reimbursement. Resolved: That the members of the task force are not entitled to any reimbursement or compensation for attendance at meetings of the task force, except that the members of the task force who are Legislators are entitled to receive the legislative per diem and reimbursement for travel expenses for attendance at meetings of the task force. The Executive Director of the Legislative Council shall administer the task force's budget; and be it further

46 Sec. 7. Report. Resolved: That the task force shall submit its report, together with any necessary implementing legislation, to
48 the Second Regular Session of the 118th Legislature no later than February 2, 1998. If the task force requires an extension, it
50 may apply to the Legislative Council, which may grant the extension; and be it further

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2 The Department of Human Services and the Bureau of Insurance within the Department of Professional and Financial Regulation 4 will incur some minor additional costs to participate as members of the task force. These costs can be absorbed within the 6 respective agencies' existing budgeted resources.'

SUMMARY

This amendment replaces the bill. It establishes the Task 12 Force to Study the Feasibility of a Single Claims Processing System for 3rd-party Payors of Health Care Benefits. 14

It also adds an emergency preamble, an emergency clause, an appropriation section and a fiscal note to the bill.
